Tuskegee and Vaccine Hesitancy

The Tuskegee experiment created enduring mistrust between the medical system and Black American communities, contributing to health disparities in the pandemic. Now, relatives of those involved in the Tuskegee experiment are <u>promoting the COVID-19 vaccine in an ad campaign</u> to help their communities get vaccinated.

Voluntary Mask Guidance

As scientists learn more about the Delta variant, government officials are taking <u>precautionary</u> <u>action</u> to curb COVID-19 transmission. L.A. County officials are encouraging <u>masks to be</u> <u>worn indoor</u>, even for fully vaccinated individuals.

Heat Waves, Lava Fire, and Fireworks

With the Pacific Northwest enduring record-breaking temperatures and <u>a lava fire</u> exploding in Northern California, officials are urging people to refrain from <u>illegal fireworks</u> due to high fire danger this weekend.

Coastal Vulnerability and the Miami Condo Rescue Operation


Every week, we'll dedicate space for a hot topic that we think is especially important for emergency managers to read. As the Delta variant and others pose a growing threat to the world, the question grows: Are the vaccines as effective against the variants as they are for the original strain?

Resources to keep up-to-date on variants and vaccines

- The <u>CDC COVID-19 Tracker</u> is keeping a close eye on the estimated proportions of infection within the U.S. are due to different variants.
- Wondering what vaccines are available and how they stand up against each other?
 Check out the Lancet's COVID-19 Vaccine Tracker.
- Vaccine efficacy is a hot topic but hard to track since studies of effectiveness cannot control for the variants participants are exposed to in the real world. Good sources to watch for updates include: NPR Health; WHO COVID-19 vaccine tracker and landscape; Johns Hopkins coronavirus resource center

What's the score?

Just how effective each vaccine is at protecting against COVID-19 and its variants is still being determined. Some studies provide percentages for the efficacy of the vaccines after tracking vaccinated individuals over time, while others use lab results on neutralizing antibody titers. So, the answer of effective each vaccine is against each variant is "it depends" and "we're still figuring it out." But the following are current estimates of how protective scientists THINK each vaccine is against the concerning variants in the U.S. Since the research is ongoing, the score is likely to keep changing with more evidence and time.



Note: These numbers are current estimates of level protection against symptomatic disease but can change/differ depending on the conditions of the study, outcome being measured (protection from symptomatic disease, severe disease, infection), context in which it's conducted (location, variant exposure, non-human research, etc.). These numbers come from NBC, NPR, Business Wire, Beckers Hospital Review, Business Insider, NPR Health, FDA, and Fox News.
