Emergency Management Performance Grant

 The Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Notice of Funding Opportunity was released on April 13 and includes the provision of \$405.1 million in funding to assist SLTT governments with emergency management capabilities and preparedness activities. Shifts in COVID-19 Response

• There were several COVID-19 announcements this week. On April 12, HHS Secretary Xavier Becerra renewed the <u>Public Health Emergency declaration</u>, which has been in place since January 27, 2020. The <u>declaration</u> provides funding and access to resources to support a federal response to a public health emergency. On Monday, after a federal judge <u>overturned the CDC mask mandate</u> for public transit, numerous airlines, Uber, Amtrak, and the TSA dropped the mask requirement. On Wednesday, the DOJ <u>appealed the decision</u>.

Investments for the 2022 Fire Season

 In response to increasingly intense fire seasons, the Oregon legislature designated \$4.5 million for a <u>system that monitors wildfires</u>. The ALERTWildfire camera network system that is already implemented in parts of OR, NV, CA, WA, and ID allows agencies, firefighters, and the public to track wildfires. Also in wildfire news, PG&E agreed to pay more than <u>\$55 million in fines</u> for last year's Dixie Fire and the 2019 Kincade Fire. The deal allows PG&E to avoid criminal prosecution for the fires that were caused by the company's power lines.

Are You an Emergency Manager? FEMA Wants You

FEMA is accepting nominations for its <u>Emergency Manager Exchange</u> – a sixmonth assignment to FEMA that is designed to strengthen the bonds between the agency and its state and local partners. If you don't make the first round, a future rotation is planned for next January.



Every issue, we'll dedicate space for a topic that we think is especially important for emergency management and public health professionals to read. This week, we highlight counterterrorism mitigation activities. The size, scope, and complexity of counterterrorism initiatives can seem daunting for SLTT, nonprofit, and higher education entities. Below, we outline resources, recent events, and insights into effective counterterrorism programs:

- The <u>Brooklyn subway shooting</u>, near <u>cyberattack on Hawaii's communications</u> <u>infrastructure</u>, and the ninth anniversary of the <u>Boston Marathon bombings</u> last week highlight the importance of local preparation for targeted violence and cybersecurity threats.
- Several federal programs through the DOJ and DHS provide resources to support SLTT counterterrorism measures, including <u>CISA</u>, the <u>National Counterterrorism</u> <u>Center (NCTC)</u>, the <u>FBI</u>, and the <u>Joint Counterterrorism Assessment Team (JCAT)</u> The JCAT is comprised of SLTT first responders and public safety professionals and works with federal counterintelligence analysts to develop tools for SLTT agencies.
- The Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) testified before Congress earlier this year on the <u>evolution of domestic terrorism</u>. CSIS suggested that increased federal data analysis and counterterrorism training and resources would improve SLTT agency and nonprofit preparedness. An Oregon <u>report</u> also indicated that effective counterterrorism programs require a multifaceted, multi-agency approach at the national, state, and local level.

Resources to Support Your Counterterrorism Initiatives

Effective counterterrorism programs require risk mitigation at all levels, and knowing where to start to get information can be overwhelming. Below, we compiled several resources, including guides, programs, and grant funding, to support SLTT programs and personal and community preparedness.

- Leverage Federal Resources for SLTT Partners: Check out the <u>JCAT</u>
 <u>Counterterrorism Guide for Public Safety Personnel</u>. The <u>Center for Prevention</u>
 <u>Programs and Partnerships</u> has resources, Community Awareness Briefings, and
 Regional Prevention Coordinators to support SLTT partners with counterterrorism
 initiatives. CISA also has <u>SLTT cybersecurity best practices and toolkits</u>.
- Take Advantage of Grant Funding: The <u>Targeted Violence and Terrorism Grant Program (TVTP)</u> provides funds to SLTT, nonprofits, and higher education entities to develop counterterrorism capabilities. The <u>Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP)</u> FY22 deadline is June 13. HSGP includes the State Homeland Security Program (SHSP), Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI), and Operation Stonegarden (OPSG). Talk to your <u>State Administrative Agency (SAA)</u> and reference the <u>FEMA Preparedness Grants Manual</u> about funding options.
- Increased Public Awareness: Government officials can alert their community to
 preparation measures, including developing a <u>Family Disaster Plan</u>, joining a
 Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), and working with <u>businesses</u>,
 <u>schools</u>, and <u>public gathering places</u> on security measures for targeted violence
 and cybersecurity threats.
