Takeaways from the IAEM Conference: Meeting Community Needs

CONSTANT attended the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM) Conference last month. One of our takeaways was the continued challenges with meeting community needs given the frequency of natural disasters and equity considerations.

Natural disasters are increasing in frequency and intensity, posing significant challenges to communities worldwide. These events disproportionately impact low-income communities and marginalized groups who often lack the resources to recover. The long-term consequences of disasters can be devastating, leading to economic hardship, housing instability, and mental and behavioral health challenges being experienced by the

community. Communities with less access to resources also experience inequities during disaster response and recovery.

Reducing barriers to support, expanding access to programs, and promoting inclusivity and equity are paramount to work conducted throughout the emergency management community. As 2025 nears, here are a few research findings, tips, and resources to consider next year whilst developing, strengthening, and sustaining mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery programs:

- Future trends in emergency management: Collectively, trends are redefining how communities organize, identify with local associations, and respond to emergencies, emphasizing the need for adaptive and equitable disaster management strategies. Currently, trends include ongoing population shifts into high-risk areas, such as hurricane-prone coastal regions; demographic shifts, such as the rising prevalence of chronic health conditions; the aging population, driven by the Baby Boom generation, reshaping community needs; immigration contributing to increasing ethnic and linguistic diversity of urban and suburban areas; and employment trends and emerging technologies reshaping how people commute and spend their leisure time, affecting community dynamics and preparedness efforts.
- Studies emphasize importance of equitable initiatives: A research finding from
 the <u>Census Bureau's Community Resilience Equity Supplement</u> links social
 vulnerability and income inequality, noting that 24% of people residing in counties
 with high income inequality are socially vulnerable to disasters. This data shows the
 need for systemic reinvestment in socially vulnerable communities and the need for
 emergency managers to prioritize those who are socially vulnerable during
 emergency response and recovery.
- Strategies for bridging gaps in resources, support, and decision-making opportunities: Addressing equity in the emergency management cycle requires integrating inclusive strategies at every stage to ensure that marginalized groups have access to resources, support, and decision-making opportunities. Across all phases, training emergency managers in cultural competence and implicit bias helps facilitate fair resource allocation, while partnerships with advocacy organizations for marginalized groups enhance inclusivity and representation. These integrated approaches promote resilience and equity, ensuring no community is left behind.
 - Mitigation: For mitigation, data-driven tools like the <u>Resilience Analysis</u> and <u>Planning Tool (RAPT)</u> help identify disparities in risk and vulnerability, enabling targeted interventions. Equity-focused hazard mitigation planning involves including diverse stakeholders to create strategies that address systemic inequities.
 - **Preparedness:** During the preparedness phase, it is vital to engage underrepresented groups in planning through partnerships with trusted community-based organizations. Multilingual outreach materials can help ensure non-English speakers receive critical preparedness information.
 - **Response:** In the response phase, equitable distribution of resources is key, prioritizing aid to high-vulnerability communities and ensuring emergency shelters are accessible for individuals with disabilities or chronic illnesses.
 - Recovery: Recovery efforts should empower affected communities to lead rebuilding initiatives, emphasizing equitable funding for housing and small businesses in underserved areas. Accessible mental health resources are also essential to address disaster-related trauma.

Emergency Management Round Up

FEMA launched the <u>Strategic Foresight 2050 report</u>, which outlines five themes representing the state of the emergency management landscape and foresighted scenarios to account for within the uncertain future. In other FEMA news, <u>\$200M has been made available</u> through the Flood Mitigation Assistance grant for states impacted by

flooding incidents. Finally, last week, <u>a 7.0 magnitude earthquake</u> was reported off the Northern Carolina coast with tsunami warnings issued briefly. Local news assessed alert and warning tied to the event.

CISA and Partners Release Guidance and Reports

CISA, NSA, and the FBI released a <u>Guide for Protecting Communications Infrastructure</u> that summarizes best practices for protecting communication networks against threat actors. Last month, CISA also published <u>a Venue Guide for Security Considerations</u> to assist venue operators in creating secure environments. A New <u>Resilient Power Guidance</u> was added to the CISA Resilient Toolkit Portal. Finally, a summary report released in November summarizes 2023's top routinely exploited vulnerabilities.

Bird Flu, COVID-19, and Public Health Policy Issues

At time of writing, there are <u>58 confirmed human cases of H5 bird flu</u>. Officials are concerned about <u>cases with unknown origin</u>, and the implications they pose for the potential of community spread. This is further exacerbated by a <u>recent study</u> that suggests that a bird flu mutation could let the virus latch easily to human cells. In other public health news, a <u>520-page COVID-19 report</u> by a House Select Subcommittee was released after a 2 year investigation and the ASTHO unveiled five public health policy issues to watch in 2025.
